



PARKING MULTIPLE VEHICLES IN FRONT AND REAR YARDS

CONSISTENT REPORTING is CRITICAL to receive enforcement.

It is against the law to park vehicles on the front grass lawn of a house in the City of Winnipeg.

The [City of Winnipeg's Zoning By-Law \(Section 172.\(8\)\(b\) 200-2006\)](#) states a maximum of 6 vehicles can park on a single and two-family dwelling, which may include:

- a maximum of 4 passenger vehicles;
- a maximum of 1 travel trailer or 1 motor home; and
- a maximum of 1 truck having a registered gross vehicle weight less than 15,000 lbs
- between May 15 and October 31, a max. of 1 recreational vehicle, travel trailer, or motor home may be parked on a driveway leading to a parking space in the principal building or in a side or rear yard.

RECOMMENDED REPORTING for MULTIPLE VEHICLES

- If possible, speak to your neighbor in person to share your concerns. Try to develop a positive relationship. You may want to leave a flyer in the mailbox if you are unable to speak to your neighbour. A flyer on this topic has been created for you to print and leave in the mailbox. When reporting to 311:

- Report the number of vehicles, make and model
- Report if they are parking in the front or back yard of the house
- Report if you think the address may be a rental property
- Take 3-4 photos and email when you report, ensuring you capture license plate numbers

EXPECTED RESPONSE from the CITY:

- The City of Winnipeg By-law Enforcement Officer will respond within 10 business days to conduct an investigation.
- The Officer will monitor the address and the vehicles parked on the property
- The Office may issue a Compliance Order to the resident

The City of Winnipeg is making changes to its parking by-laws, and it is anticipated these changes will be approved by summer of 2016. These changes will allow Winnipeg Parking Authority to issue tickets on private property – which currently cannot occur! This change will have a very positive impact for residents in Fort Richmond and University Heights.
